St Vincent de Paul supports families in need in our area on an emergency basis. Each day a team is available to visit and deliver groceries in the area. This year we have made **211** visits delivering groceries to **349** adults and **150** children.

Every Friday a team along with Father George visit up to 11 shut-ins in the Abbotsford area.

A group of volunteers visit and deliver a hamper to the Poor Clare Sisters at Easter and Christmas time.


### Mission Statement

**St. Vincent de Paul** (24 April 1581 – 27 September 1660) was a French Roman Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He is venerated as a **saint** in the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. He was canonized in 1737.

**Antoine-Frédéric Ozanam** ; April 23, 1813 – September 8, 1853) was a French literary scholar, lawyer, journalist and social justice advocate. He founded with fellow students the Conference of Charity, later known as the **Society of Saint Vincent de Paul**
